GENDER PAY GAP REPORT 2021

This is the gender pay gap report 2021 for the UK registered branch of Mitsubishi Electric Europe B.V.; a company registered under the laws of the Netherlands; and is a snapshot as of 5th April 2021.

- The mean gender pay gap is 25.6%.
- The median gender pay gap is 31.8%.
- The mean gender bonus gap is 50.2%.
- The median gender bonus is 28.8%.
- The proportion of male employees in Mitsubishi Electric Europe B.V. receiving a bonus is 72.5% and the proportion of female employees receiving a bonus is 84.7%.

The figures set out above have been calculated using the standard methodologies used in the Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017.
